Airlines unaccompanied minor policy?

Delta Airlines unaccompanied minor policy is designed to provide a safe and well-managed travel experience for children flying alone. The service is mandatory for kids aged 5 to 14 and optional for those aged 15 to 17 who may want extra assistance during their journey. Under this program, trained airline staff supervise children from check-in until arrival, ensuring they are never left unattended. Children between 5 and 7 years old are only allowed to travel on nonstop flights, while those aged 8 to 14 can fly on select connecting routes. Parents or guardians must complete required forms, provide accurate contact information, and stay at the airport until the flight departs. A designated adult must also be available at the destination with valid identification to pick up the child. This process ensures safety, accountability, and a smooth travel experience for young passengers.

Delta Airlines also charges an unaccompanied minor service fee, which covers supervision, assistance, and monitoring throughout the journey. Airline staff escort children through security, boarding, and any connecting flights while providing continuous care. Children are usually given wristbands or identification badges so airline personnel can easily identify and assist them. Parents are encouraged to pack snacks, entertainment, and all necessary documents to ensure comfort during the trip. Communication between airline staff and guardians is maintained to provide updates and reassurance at every stage.
